Example: The University of Sydney Business School (Australia)



- **Partnership launched:** 2024
- **Programs offered:** New York Internship Program
- **Students supported annually:** Up to 37 each January
- **Program model:** Credit-bearing, faculty-led, cohort-based business internships

Impact Overview

The University of Sydney Business School collaborates with The Intern Group to deliver a tailored global internship program aligned with its mission to graduate globally aware, work-ready students.
